TOWN OF WILMINGTON SCHOLARSHIPS

AWARDS: \$250 to \$2,000 (number of recipients to be determined)

ELIGIBILITY: **The recipients of these scholarships must be residents of the Town of Wilmington, a senior in high school, and must have been accepted to pursue education beyond the secondary school level at an institution deemed accredited by the Scholarship Committee.**

CRITERIA FOR DETERMINING WINNERS:

- A. Financial need
- B. Academic standing, including four (4) year transcript
- C. Student activity: list all activities, i.e. Class Officer, clubs, yearbook staff, etc.
- D. Community Service: all involvement in community – volunteer, church service or charity groups, i.e. Boy Scouts, Rainbow, hospital volunteer
- E. **Two letters** of recommendation from any of the following:
 - * School Administrators
 - * Department Heads
 - * Coaches
 - * Guidance Counselors
 - * Teacher
 - * Advisors

Any other individual who, in the opinion of the applicant, can testify as to the qualifications of and/or community involvement of the applicant

- F. Letter of Intent: An essay, containing approximately 250 words on “What Wilmington Means to Me” shall be submitted with each application
- G. Name of the College student will be attending
- H. Personal interview may be required
